7 REPORTS



7.1 COMMUNITY GRANTS ASSESSMENTS 2025

1. PURPOSE

This report provides the Grants Committee with the opportunity to consider and decide on the 55 applications received during the Annual Community Grants Fund.

2. SIGNIFICANCE

The matters for decision in this report are not considered to be of significance under the Significance and Engagement Policy.

3. BACKGROUND

The Community Grants Fund is an annual fund managed and distributed by Carterton District Council. These funds are available for projects, events and services provided for the Carterton community.

The Council's Long-Term Plan sets the funding available for community support through grants, and this is reviewed and renewed at each Annual Plan.

The Carterton District Community Grants Policy provides the framework for allocating grants to groups and organisations that contribute to the outcomes and vision of Carterton being a 'A welcoming and vibrant community where we all enjoy living'.

Furthermore, Community Grants enable the community to achieve outcomes that align with our obligations under the Local Government Act to promote the social, economic, environmental, and cultural well-being of communities in the present and for the future.

'Community outcomes' are the outcomes, that a local authority aims to achieve to promote the social, economic, environmental, and cultural well-being of its district or region, in the present and for the future.

Applicants apply for funding via Smarty Grants, an online programme.

4. DISCUSSION

Grants are considered under two sections: Local Community Grants and Regional Community Grants. The total budget available to allocate is \$184,750, which is split between Regional \$109,750 and Local \$75,000.

The role of the Grants Committee is to assess all applications. The committee has received all applications in advance of this meeting, enabling time for reading and pre assessment of all 55 applications (via CDC's Smarty Grants portal).

Regional Community Grants Fund:

- 30 applications were received to the regional section of the community grants fund, requesting a total of \$199,062.67
- Regional grants support entities which may not be based in Carterton but undertake an activity or project that has regional benefits, including in the Carterton District.
- The Grants Policy includes the criteria which will guide the decisions on the allocations of the regional grants.

Local Community Grants Fund:

- 25 applications were received to the local section of the community grants fund, requesting a total of \$138,463.91
- Local Grants support local Carterton entities where activities will benefit the Carterton community.
- The Grants Policy includes the criteria in which will guide the decisions on the allocations of the local grants.

6. NEXT STEPS

Once decisions have been made officers will advise all applicants of the outcomes on their application via an emailed letter through the Smarty Grants portal.

Officers will monitor all grants and follow up with accountability forms leading into the 2026 grants round.

7. CONSIDERATIONS

7.1 Climate change

Applications are measured against community wellbeing outcomes and environmental considerations form part of this. Therefore, climate change and actions or initiatives that contribute to mitigating and improving community wellbeing in this space are considered.

7.2 Tāngata whenua

Applications are measured against community wellbeing outcomes and cultural considerations form part of this. Actions or initiatives that contribute to improving community wellbeing in this space are considered.

7.3 Financial impact

The Community Grants fund is budgeted as part of our Long Term and Annual planning process.

7.4 Community Engagement requirements

Community grants are advertised widely in the lead up to the Grants round opening via the CDC website and social media channels and also in the Carterton Crier, the Wairarapa Times Age/Midweek and on radio.

7.5 Risks

No risks have been identified.

7.6 Wellbeings

All Community Grants enable the community to achieve outcomes that align with our obligations under the Local Government Act to promote the social, economic, environmental, and cultural well-being of communities in the present and for the future.
