1 REPORTS

4.1 WAINGAWA WATER STORAGE PROJECT (COUNCIL WORKSHOP)

1. PURPOSE

For Council to discuss the findings of the business case for the Waingawa Water Storage Project.

Discussion

- Councillors noted the initial business case, land acquisition, information, technical reports and cost estimates provided.
- The total project cost is 18.3M (including land purchase), but could increase to \$21M (excluding land purchase) which (for the relatively small increase in price) would provide double capacity water storage.
- The benefits are selling the water, not selling the gravel (due to high margins).
- There is support from Kānoa (MBIE) to underwrite the project.
- This asset would remain with CDC and wouldn't be transferred to the Wairarapa-Tararua
 Water Services Entity.
- The business case assumed uptake over a 20 year period. The water could be used by both industry and agriculture.
